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Texoma Community Center Opens New Criminal Justice Collaboration Transitional Living Facility

(Denison, Texas, January 28, 2020) Texoma Community Center (TCC) is proud to announce the opening of an eight bed Criminal Justice Collaboration Transitional Living Facility on February 17, 2020, located at 102 Memorial in Denison, TX. The outpatient facility will serve those in the criminal justice system with severe and persistent mental illness who might be in danger of homelessness, psychiatric hospitalization, or additional contact with law enforcement.

The Criminal Justice Collaboration Transitional Living Facility, in conjunction with the Forensic and TCOOMMI (Texas Correctional Office on Offenders with Mental and Medical Impairments) programs, will offer a wide range of services to its residents while also allowing residents to have an independent lifestyle. Services include individual and group therapy, intensive case management with an interdisciplinary team approach, educational groups, and extracurricular activities.

TCC is excited to provide a much-needed service that has not previously been available in our area. We look forward to continuing to provide quality services to the three counties we serve: Fannin, Cooke, and Grayson.

TCC is one of 39 Texas Community Centers, which are governmental entities as defined by Title 7 of the Texas Health and Safety Code. TCC also operates a 501.C.3 Non-profit for fundraising purposes. All fundraising activities and donations are provided under the Texoma Community Center, Volunteer Services Council.

TCC envisions a system that promotes and enhances access to intellectual, developmental, and behavioral health services that improve the lives of those in our community. By strengthening resiliency and supporting recovery, TCC is committed to delivering quality services through partnerships with individuals, families, and community stakeholders.
